## 1.2 To Whom

The NAP-CIDM spells out detailed work areas, activities and agencies responsible for CIDM along with identified target groups with time-frame. The plan also addresses the indicators of progress for monitoring and review. NAP-CIDM deals with:-

- (1) The ministries/agencies concerned, in turn, shall:-
  - i) issue guidance on implementation of the plans to all stakeholders;
  - ii) obtain periodic reports from the stakeholders on the progress of implementation of the CIDM Plans;
  - iii) evaluate the progress of implementation of the plans against the time-frame and take corrective action, wherever needed;
  - iv) disseminate the status of progress and issue further guidance on implementation of the plans to stakeholders; and
  - v) report the progress of implementation of National Plan to the nodal ministry i.e. MoEF.
- (2) The specific target institutions/authorities are:-
  - i) Industries: management and employees, from both large to small scale;
  - ii) Transporters: pipeline, ship, road, rail, etc.; and
  - iii) Authorities: those concerned with the District Disaster Management Plan under the Environment (Protection) Act 1986 and Disaster Management Act 2005, as well as policymakers from the relevant ministries (both central and state); District Administration; State and District Crisis Groups, State Industrial Development Corporations (SIDCO), Chief Inspector of Factories of the states (CIFs), Petroleum

and Natural Gas Regulatory Board (PNGRB), Petroleum and Explosives Safety Organisation (PESO), Directorate General of Factory Advice Services & Labour Institute (DGFASLI), Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) and State Pollution Control Boards (SPCBs).

- (3) Public and first responders deal with:-
  - Public: including vulnerable groups (i.e. old age persons, women and children etc), local community, NGOs and educational institutions (i.e. schools, colleges, medical and engineering colleges); and
  - ii) Emergency & Rescue Teams (Emergency Response Agencies): Police, Fire Stations, Medical Services, Civil Defence, the Armed Forces especially NDRF/SDRF, Coast Guard, Home Guard, Transport Agency from District Administration, etc.

## (4) Others

- Training providers offering human resource development services for the targeted groups as identified above;
- ii) Flora and Fauna; and
- iii) Media (both print and electronic).

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
